VAUGHAN COUNCIL.

The inaugural meeting of the Council of Vaughan was held in the Township Hall, on Monday, the 11th of January.

The following members-elect, having executed the declaration of qualification, and of office, took their seats and proceeded to business:—Reeve, D. C. Longhouse; Dep-Reeve, J. A. Cameron; Councillors, J. S. McNair, Wm. Thomas, J. T. Saigeon.

A large number of accounts were read and ordered to be paid for gravel, general road accounts, etc.

McNair—Cameron—That Archibald Cummings be appointed caretaker of the Township Hall, also stable, shed and grounds in connection therewith for the year 1909. Carried.

Thomas—McNair—That the Clerk be authorized to subscribe for 6 copies Municipal World for the use of the Council and Clerk. Carried.

McNair—Thomas—That the Treasurer pay to J. Ross Robertson for Sick Children's Hospital, \$10.00. Carried.

Cameron—Thomas—That the Treasurer pay David C. Murray the sum of \$25 on account of the loss he sustained by fire.—Carried.

Saigeon—McNair—That the members of this Council meet the members of Markham Council at Richmond Hill on the 12th of January to discuss the advisability of appealing the Machell case, also to discuss the Gumble case and Vanderburgh culvert. Carried.

Saigeon—Cameron—That the Treasurer pay to James Bowes for the burial of George Plastoe the sum of \$7.72. Carried.

Cameron—McNair—That the Treasurer be authorized to refund the following amounts to Dugald McDonald, collector:—Chas. Shaw, wrongfully assessed, \$1.00; David Blain, wrongfully assessed, 30 cents.

Saigeon—Cameron—That the Council comply with the request of the Ontario Municipal Association by petitioning the Legislature to repeal section 606 of the Municipal Act and thereby relieve municipalities from a portion of their present heavy responsibility for the non-repair of the highway, and that Dr. Godfrey, our representative in the House, be requested to present the petition and support the bill when it comes up for consideration. Carried.

Thomas—Saigeon—That the Treasurer be authorized to pay the following accounts:—To E. W. Brown, printing and binding 300 copies of minutes for 1908, \$70.00; to J. S. McNair, expenses re Machell case, \$21.45. Markham to pay half. Carried.

Cameron—Saigeon—That the Council hold its regular meetings on the second Tuesday of each month at 10 a.m. during the remainder of the year except the months of May, June, November and December, when said meetings will be held on the 25th, 15th, 10th and 7th respectively, and during August and September at 1 p.m., and that the Clerk get printed 100 copies for distribution, with the names of Fence-Viewers and Pound-Keepers printed on said notices. Carried.

The following by-laws were passed:—No. 357—Appointing Geo. M. Arnold and Neil Wm. Malloy auditors. No. 358—Appointing J. J. Kaiser and E. White assessors.

No. 359—Appointing a local Board of Health, Medical Health Officer and Sanitary Inspector as follows: Board of Health, D. C. Longhouse, J. B. McLean, Leeds Richardson, Amos Agar and A. McNeil; Medical Health Officer, Dr. Robinson; Sanitary Inspector, Jas. O'Connor.

No. 360—Regulating salaries and allowances to be paid the officials of the Township.

No. 361—Appointing Fence-Viewers and Pound-Keepers for 1909. The Council adjourned to meet on the 9th of February.

Abram Carley and Luke Gibbons as auditors, Malcolm McCullum and Zenas Black as Assessors, appointing time and place for holding meetings of the council for current year.

Council adjourned to meet at Temperance Hall, Keuleby, on Saturday, the 20th day of February, at 10.30 o'clock, a.m.
