Dr. P. D. McLean, the Liberal candidate in the last election, spoke briefly thanking everyone for the efforts made in his behalf during the campaign and dwelling on the excellent record of the

Liberal Gövernment.

Mra.T. C. Robinette, K.C., gave a very interesting resume of the principal athievement of the Liberal party since conting to office, and made a striking comparison between these results and those of the eighteen years previous of Conservative rule.

Senator Campbell claimed that the people of Canada asked of a Government mainly that it should be honest, straightforward and exercise its best judgement in its conduct of affairs. Taken in the aggregate the Liberal Government had given the people of Canada an honest, economical and progressive government. The people knew this, and in spite of all the accusations and the villifications indulged in by Conservative orators during the last campaign, the people had shown their good sense by returning the Government to power, After referring briefly to the tariff, immigration and other topics, the Senator spoke on the railway situation, and stated it as his opinion that the increased value of land, timber and minerals resulting from the construction of the Grand Trunk Pacific would pay the cost of the road ten times over.

Mr. F. G. Inwood made a brief address, concluding with an outline of the cardinal points in organization which tend to success. The four principal points were a good cause, a good leader, a thoroughly revised voters' list, and sub-division workers who

would work.

Mr. Porter introduced a resolution expressing the gratification of the association at the Government's action in suggesting an Imperial Conference for the purpose of considering a comprehensive scheme of defence for the component parts of the empire. This was carried unanimously.


