"Mamma!" piped a tremulous little voice from the upper landing.

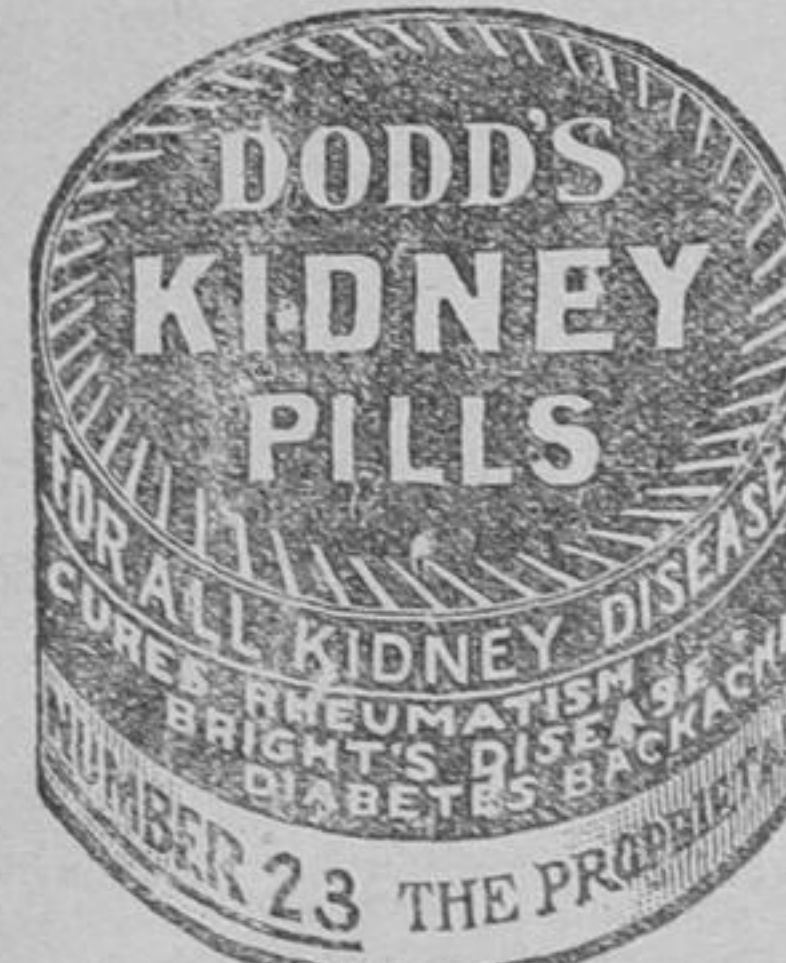
"Yes, dearie?"

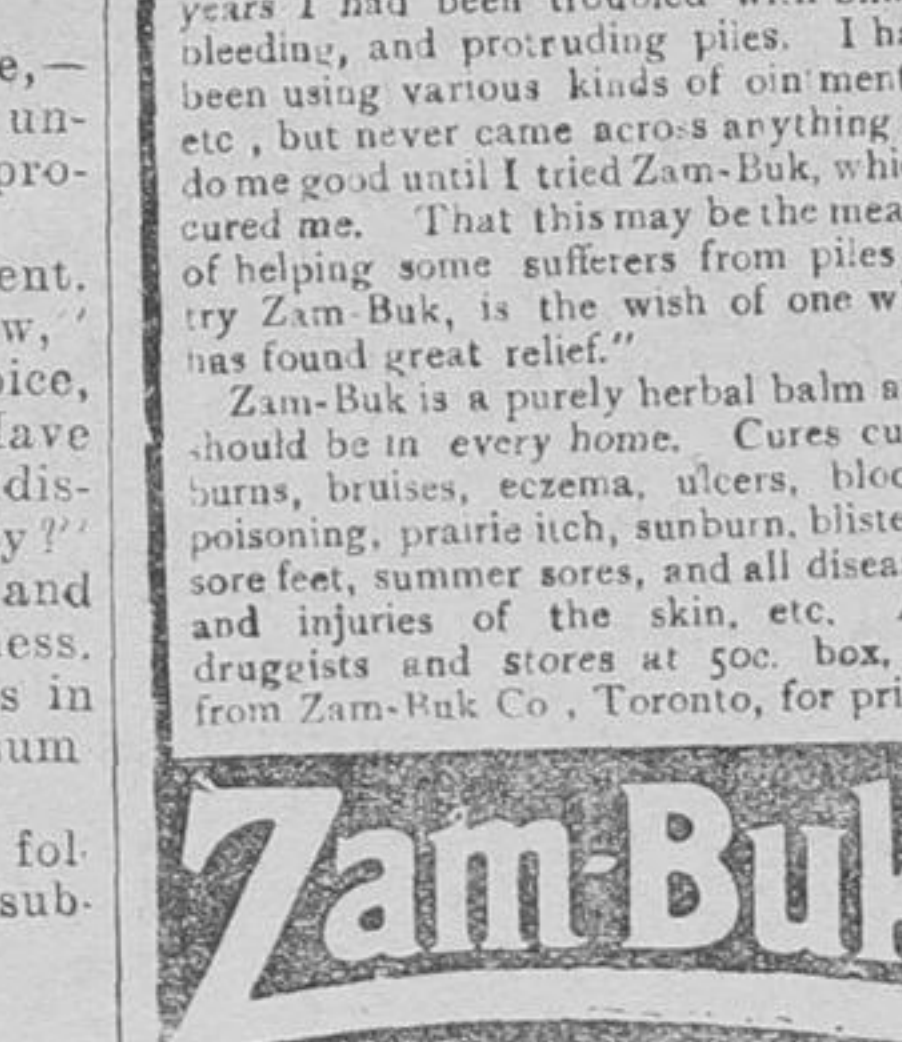
