In Peru at the period of the Incas, before its conquest by the Spaniards in the early part of the sixteenth century, poverty was locunted a crime. The whole terri-tory was divided into three portions, and the respective revenues and resources were given (1) to support the priesthood and ceremonial worship of the sun, who was their god; (2) to the reigning Inca for the expenses of the royal household and the cost of government; (3) to the people at so much a head. The extent of land apportioned to each householder was regulated by the size of his family. This nation of workers wrought as one man for the common good. STRIKES COST 30,000 YEARS.

Startling Figures Compiled by British Labor Department.

Mr. G. R. Askwith, K. C., permanent secretary to the Board of Trade of Britain, in the 21st annual report of the Labor Department on strikes and lock-outs in the United Kingdom in 1908, and on Conciliation and Arbitration Boards, says that the "amount of industrial disturbances caused by trade disputes was greater in 1908 than in any year since 1898. Three disputesthose of the engineering and shipbuilding industries on the northeast coast and in the cotton spinning industry in Lancashire -- accounted for this. They laid idle 160,000 people, and caused the loss of $8\frac{1}{4}$ million working days—the number of workpeople involved in all the other 396 disputes being 129,000, and the working days lost

2½ millions only. Of 399 disputes which began in 1908, 57 directly involved 157,841 work people, or 70 per cent. of the total involved in all the disputes of the year, were brought to a close by conciliation, or by refer-ence to arbitration. Mr. Askwith says :-- "It is satisfactory to note the increasing use that is being made of methods of conciliation and arbitration. The shipbuilding dispute led to a series of confer-ences, as a result of which machinery was set up early in 1909 for dealing with differences between employers and work people in this industry, while in the engineering trade and in the cotton industry similar arrangements are being considered.

ILLUMINATING SHELLS.

Experiments have recently been made at Toulon with shells intended to illuminate the sea at a distance from the land, thus disclosing the presence and movements of an enemy at night. The shells are made to explode at a great height, and to give lighe for a sufficient time to permit an examination of the surface of the sea for several miles from the shore. The officers in charge of the experiments regard the illuminating shells as more effective than search-lights in disclosing the position of hostile ships. Another form of shell has been prorosed, which shall, in bursting over the sea, spread a cloud of thick smoke about the batteries on shore, thus preventing them from seeing the approaching ships, and render-ing the illuminating s' ells useless.


