## Unique Ceremony Observed Annually in India.


A strange custom of fire-walking is carried out annually at Mushirabad, a suburb of Hyderabad, India, on the anniversary of the twentieth day after the death of Imam Hussain.

Several cartloads of firewood are gathered together in an open space in front of the "Asboorkhana," and at midnight the heap is set alight. The wood burns steadily for some two hours, the heat being so intense that no one can stand within a distance of at least a dozen yards from the fire. When it is burnt out, the live charcoal is spread out six yards. When everything is ready, two men bearing "alms" standards-jump barefooted on to this fiery carpet, and walk across it, not once, but at least a dozen times. The heat from the glowing embers is more fiery than when the wood is burning. The jumping of the first two men is a signal to the others, and soon several hundred persons have followed their exam-


The strangest thing about this unique ceremony is that no one aprears to receive any hurt.


