Unique Ceremony Observed Annually in India.

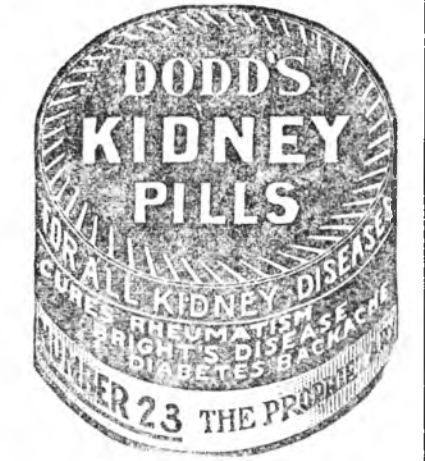
A strange custom of fire-walking is carried out annually at Mushirabad, a suburb of Hyderabad, India, on the anniversary of the twentieth day after the death of Imam Hussain.

Several cartloads of firewood are gathered together in an open space in front of the "Asboorkhana," and at midnight the heap is set alight. The wood burns steadily for some two hours, the heat being so intense that no one can stand within a distance of at least a dozen yards from the fire. When it is burnt out, the live charcoal is spread out evenly on the ground in the form of a circle, with a diameter of about six yards. When everything is ready, two men bearing "alms"—standards—jump barefooted on to this fiery carpet, and walk across it, not once, but at least a dozen times. The heat from the glowing embers is more fiery than when the wood is burning. The jumping of the first two men is a signal to the others, and soon several hundred persons have followed their example.

The strangest thing about this unique ceremony is that no one appears to receive any hurt.

Even children of all ages jump into the fire, and run across it, without the least hesitation, and all seem to be at home.

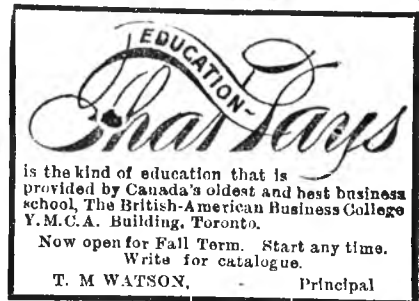
