MR. PADGET IN ERROR.

At the Markham Township nomination meeting on Monday of this week, Councillor Padget, who is in the field for deputy-reeve against Mr. George Morrison, was asked by Mr. Walter Scott to explain how it was that in letting the contract for the Township printing for the present year, one tenderer was permitted to see the lowest tender before the matter was laid before the Council; and also allowed to lower his tender sufficiently to obtain the contract.

In his answer Mr. Padget, who is on the printing committee, stated that had the contract been given to THE LIBERAL, whose tender was the lowest, the work would have to be done at The Economist office, as The Liberal had obtained the contract for Vaughan Township printing, and was not able to do both.

The Liberal has no desire to meddle with municipal matters in Markham township, but in justice to ourselves we must say that Mr. Padget had no ground for making any such statement as the above, as far as we are concerned. We were asked to tender for the printing and did so, and our tender was the lowest of the three put in. Had our tender been accepted we fully intended doing the work as we had done for Markham Council on former occasions, and never hinted to Mr. Padget or any other person that we would farm it out to another office.

After getting our figures from the Printing Committee, the lucky (?) tenderer was allowed to alter his tender for the Financial Statements from 90 cents to 60 cents a page, and the Auditors' Reports from 60 cents to 35 cents a page, thus coming a little lower than our figures.

THE LIBERAL makes this statement with very much reluctance, and can say that this is the first and only time in tendering for a printing contract that we have had reason to surmise that we did not get "a square deal."

Those who attended the nomination meetings in the village and Vaughan on Monday must have been impressed with the fact that although taxes seem high as compared to what they were some years ago, there is no possible way of keeping them down, unless the members of the Councils refuse the requests of the ratepayers from time to time. Old members may be replaced by new ones, but the taxes must be levied and collected, whoever may sit in Council. In too many cases ratepayers expect Councils to be generous when money is required, and do not think of complaining until they receive their tax bills.




