

Last week's Aurora Banner says that there is great demand for houses in that town that will rent from \$7 to \$10 a month. The same paper states that Mr. T. H. Lennox, M.L.A., has purchased three large lots and has interested a Toronto company who will build six houses there this summer. Also that Mr. H. E. Proctor will erect six houses in Aurora this summer. Richmond Hill has the land, houses are very much needed, but our village is still waiting for a Lennox or a Proctor.

Canada's trade is growing by leaps and bounds. The figures for the fiscal year ending last month reached the record of \$677,142,189. This is an increase of no less than \$117,506,238 over the figures for the previous year, or over twenty per cent. The total trade of Canada under the Conservatives only increased \$66,000,000 during the eighteen years in which they were in power. This unprecedented prosperity under the Laurier administration is evidence that the country is being well governed. Everything points to the current year's total trade reaching the \$800,000,000 mark, and the total revenue will not be much short of \$110,000,000.

The date of the first sitting of the Court of Revision was set for the 7th day of June next.

The Clerk was instructed to write the Canada Ingot Iron Culvert Co. for price lists of their culverts.

On motion the leader of the Village Band was paid \$10 for services at the Rink.

By-law No. 231 was passed providing for the borrowing of certain sums of money.

The Council decided to ask for tenders for drawing gravel from Cook's Pit.
