ON CANADIAN SUBJECTS.**

The announcement made recently by Toronto Saturday Night that that journal had arranged for the publication of a series of articles by Dr. Stephen Leacock and Dr. Andrew Macphail, once more serves to remind us that Canadian writers are now receiving deserved recognition at home as well as abroad. Dr. Macphail's published volumes, such as "Essays in Fallacy," and "Essays in Puritanism," to name only two of the many, have now a circle of readers both in Canada and in England which the most optimistic would hardly have predicted at the time of publication.
