

Two great religious bodies now in session—The Roman Catholics at Montreal and the Anglicans at Halifax—have spoken very plainly of the great evils resulting from the liquor traffic, but some of the speakers saw even more danger in what is known as the social evil. One of the bishops in speaking on those questions said: "The social evil eats at the vitals of a nation like cancer. Drink may destroy its thousands, but the social evil was responsible for the destruction of tens of thousands."

In discussing the liquor traffic another speaker said that "the time had come to proclaim in strong terms that the Anglican Church was the uncompromising foe of the whole miserable traffic."

It is plainly to be seen that as the years go by the numbers of people who formerly defended the public bar are gradually diminishing.

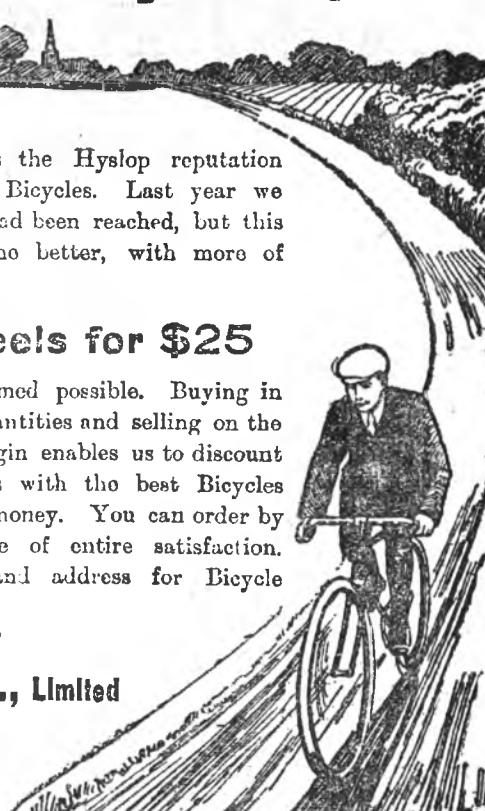
