POULTRY PRODUCTION.

Commencement of an Educational Campaign.

Statistics show that for several years past, although the Federal and Provincial Governments have tried to educate farmers to produce more poultry, still instead of an increase an actual decrease in production is taking place. Only last spring, dealers were forced to import eggs from Russia and China to supply the Canadian needs, and in an effort to overcome conditions of this kind, and to regain for Canada the place that she once held as an exporting country of poultry and eggs, the firms of Guns Ltd., and Gunn, Langlois & Co., Ltd., have joined hands in a campaign

which appears to have solved the problem.

Realizing that educational work was necessary, a demonstration station was opened in May, 1910, in Peterboro, Ont., and the services of an expert poultryman engaged, whose duty it was to hold meetings in the neighborhood, at which the benefits of proper methods and their adoption were explained.

The result of such efforts was that while the price of ordinary eggs delivered to storekeepers ran in the neighborhood of 16c to 17c per doz., 20c to 21c was paid for eggs which were marketed according to the new methods.

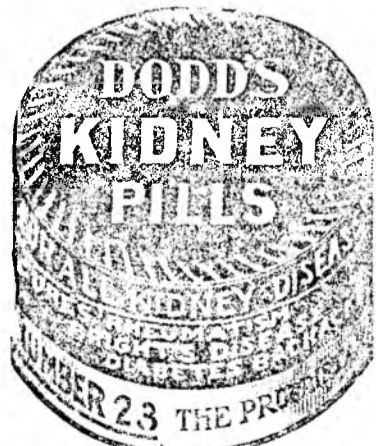
