### In France 2,000,000 Pairs are Turned Out Yearly.

It is said that in France wooden shoes to the number of two million pairs are turned out in each year. Both machine-made and hand-made shoes of this kind figure in the

French industry.
In France it is held that the best wooden shoes are those of the maple. In the provinces every Frenchwoman possesses a pair of the finer sabots for use on special occasions. These show monograms and similar designs carved on the vamps, and they are kept on the foot by ornamented leather pieces over the instep. The manufacture of these leather pieces also forms an important industry in France.

### PLOWING WITH DINAMITE.

A North Carolina farmer, discovering that the heavy clay subsoil of his farm could not he broken up with the plow to sufficient depth for proper retention of moisture and fertilizing elements, has resorted to the novel expedient of blowing up whole fields with dynamite. Observing that the growth of grain was much richer than elsewhere over spots where stumps had been pulled or dug out of the ground, and the earth stirred to the depth of several feet, he drew the conclusion that similar deep disturbances of any sort would produce like results. His watermelon-crop, for instance, benefited over 30 per cent, by the innovation.


