Municipality of Richmond Hill with Electric Lighting.

Whereas, it is desirous and necessary for the convenience of the citizens of the Village of Richmond Hill, that the streets of the said Village shall be lighted by electricity, and Whereas, it will be necessary for

the said purpose of electric lighting that certain works, such as the erection of poles, wires, etc. shall be carried on, and also that purchases of necessary material shall be made, and

Whereas, five thousand dollars is the amount of money required for the carrying on and for the completion of the aforesaid works, and

Whereas, five thousand dollars is the amount of the debt intended to be created by this By-law, and

Whereas, the amount of the whole rateable property of the Village of Richmond Hill, according to the last revised Assessment Roll of the said Village is \$217,569.00, and

Whereas, the general debenture debt of the said Village amounts to \$3,174.58 of which no part of the principal or interest is in arrear, and Whereas, in order to provide for the

said debt it is expedient to issue de-bentures of the said Corporation to the amount of five thousand dollars bearing interest at 41 per cent per annum, and that such principal shall be repayable in yearly sums extending over a period of thirty years from the date of issue of such Debeutures of such amounts that the aggregate amount payable for principal and in-terest in any year in respect of the principal shall be equal as nearly as may be to what is payable for princi-pal and interest during each of the other years of such period, and

Whereas, it will require the sum of \$306.95, to be raised annually as afore said by a special rate on the whole rateable property in the said Village for the paying of the said debt and interest. interest;

Now, therefore, the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Richmond Hill enacts as follows,—

1st, that the Reeve of the Corpora-1st, that the Reeve of the Corporation of the Village of Richmond Hill be and he is hereby authorized to borrow the said sum of five thousand dollars on the credit of the Corporation for the purposes aforesaid, and to issue Debentures of the said Corporation for the sum of five thousand dollars parable at the office of the Treasurer payable at the office of the Treasurer of the said Village.

the said Corporation,-4th, This By-law shall come into force on the First day of February, 1912. 5th, That the votes of the electors of this municipality who are entitled to vote on this By-law, shall be taken on the First day of January, 1912, commencing at nine o'clock in the morning, and closing at five o'clock in the afternoon, in the Council Chamber

in the said Village of Richmond Hill, 6th, That on Saturday, the 30th day of December, 1911, at the hour of ten o'clock in the forenoon, the Reeve of Richmond Hill shall attend at the office of the Village Clerk for the purpose of appointing in writing signed by himself, two persons to attend at the final summing up by the Village Clerk of the votes polled on this By-law, and also of appointing one person to attend at the polling place on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of promoting the passing of this By law, and one person to attend at the said polling place on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of op-

posing the passing of this By-law. 7th, That on Tuesday the 2nd day of January, 1912 the Clerk of the said Village, shall attend at his office, at the hour of ten o'clock in the forenoon, to sum up the number of votes given for and against this By-law.
