That on SATURDAY THE THIRTIETH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1911, at the Clerk's Office in the Village of Richmond Hill, the Reeve of the end Village of Richmond Hill, the Reeve of the end Village whall attend and on the said Village shall attend, and appoint in writing, signed by himself, two persons to attend at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk and one person to attend at the said polling place on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of promoting the passing of this By-law, and a like number interested in and desirous of opposing the passing of this By-

law.—
4. That the Clerk of the said Village of Richmond Hill shall attend at the Council Chamber at the hour of twelve o'clock in the forenoon on the SECOND DAY OF JANUARY, 1912 to sum up the number of votes given for and provided this France. for and against this By-law,-

5. This By-law shall come into operation and be of full force and effect on and after THE FIRST DAY OF MAY NEXT after the final passing thereof. Read a first and second time and

read in Committee.
