

BY-LAW No. —

To repeal By-law No. 203 of the Corporation of the Village of Richmond Hill.

Whereas, a petition has been presented to the Municipal Council of the Village of Richmond Hill, signed by seventy-five of the ratepayers of the said village, and praying the Council to submit a By-Law to repeal the existing Local Option By-law,—

Therefore, in accordance with the prayer of the said petitioners, the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Richmond Hill enacts as follows:—

1. That By-law No. 203 of the said Corporation of the Village of Richmond Hill, being "A By-law to prohibit the sale of intoxicating liquors by retail in the Municipality of the Village of Richmond Hill," be and it is hereby repealed,—

2. That the votes of the electors of the Village of Richmond Hill shall be taken on this By-law on the same day, at the same hour, at the same place, and by the same Deputy Returning Officer, as for the Annual Election for the Municipal Council of the said Municipality, said date being the FIRST DAY OF JANUARY, 1912.—

3. That on SATURDAY THE THIRTIETH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1911, at the Clerk's Office in the Village of Richmond Hill, the Reeve of the said Village shall attend, and appoint in writing, signed by himself, two persons to attend at the final summing up of the votes by the Clerk, and one person to attend at the said polling place on behalf of the persons interested in and desirous of promoting the passing of this By-law, and a like number interested in and desirous of opposing the passing of this By-law,—

4. That the Clerk of the said Village of Richmond Hill shall attend at the Council Chamber at the hour of twelve o'clock in the forenoon on the SECOND DAY OF JANUARY, 1912 to sum up the number of votes given for and against this By-law,—

5. This By-law shall come into operation and be of full force and effect on and after THE FIRST DAY OF MAY NEXT after the final passing thereof.

Read a first and second time and read in Committee.

Dated at Council Chamber, in the Village of Richmond Hill, this 4th day of Dec., 1911.
