



Moved by Mr. Whitmore, seconded by Mr. Witherspoon, That whereas legislation is being asked for by the Town of North To-ronto to extend in any direction for thirty miles from the aforesaid municipality, and as the lakes and springs on the highlands of York come within the limit of thirty miles, therefore this Council strongly protests against the said Town of North Toronto, or any other than bordering municipalities being allowed to have and take water from the said range of hills running through the Townships of Whitchurch, Vaughan and King, and that the Clerk of this Municipality be instructed to forward a certified copy of this resolution to the chairman of the Private Bills Committee of the American and the Dr. Cod Legislative Assembly, and to Dr. Godfrey, M.L.A., requesting the latter to strongly oppose the legislation being sought by said Town of North Toronto, JAMES A. CAMERON, Reeve.
