

IS PROFANITY INCREASING?

The Globe quite properly congratulates the Roman Catholics of Toronto on the growth of their Society formed for the purpose of pledging its members not to take the name of God in vain, and to use their influence against public profanity. In a country professedly Christian it is amazing that such an organization is necessary. Yet respectable people are shocked in passing by a group of young men, to hear the foul and blasphemous language indulged in. And generally for no apparent reason. The Provincial Secretary's report respecting the operation of the Liquor License Laws of the Province for the year ending April 30, 1911, has recently been given to the public. The report shows that the number of tavern and shop licenses has been reduced during the year by 262. The fines collected during the year was \$46,545, and in Local Option municipalities \$11,780. The number committed for drunkenness in 1911, shows an increase of 511 over the previous year.
