A retreat rather than a prison is the new institution which has been raised at Evreux, on the road from Paris to Trouville. It is ovoid in form, much in appearance to that of a large castle, and is surrounded by a wall over 30 feet in height.

It is situated on high ground overlooking the town, and to say the least prisoners should have a very comfortable time.

Each has his own cell with hammock bed, washing utensils and a table for books. The cells are lighted by electricity and heated by radiators. The authorities have not forgotten the spiritual needs of their hostages.

The consideration of the Ministry of Justice for the welfare of the prisoners is seen by an electric bell at the head of each hammock, so that the detained, if he be taken suddenly ill, can communicate with his guard.—London Globe.
