

Tuesday's World shows up the folly of the Conservative Government in tinkering with the tariff. The World says that "not a single vote was gained in Saskatchewan by cutting the cement duty in two, and not a vote would have been gained if the Government had reduced or abolished the duties in half a dozen other articles, including horses or cattle, as was at one time proposed." Yet, after reading the Dominion Government a "moral" lesson in which it says: "Don't monkey with the buzz saw and lose the friends you have for others you can't get." The World says: "Nevertheless, there must be tariff relief, but you've got to go after it in a pretty long-headed kind of way." Could anything be plainer? The World does not act from principle; its object is to catch the vote and deceive the people.

The World a few days ago in referring to Premier Borden's trip to England respecting our part to be taken in the naval defence of the Empire, said that "the policy must be a home-made policy, as the majority of Canadians look forward to seeing vessels built with Canadian material by Canadian labor in Canadian shipyards, manned and officered by Canadians, ready to protect our coasts, harbors and rivers from invasion or attack." In other words The World now advocates Sir Wilfrid Laurier's naval policy which that paper condemned previous to the 21st of last September.

The Saskatchewan General Election last Thursday shows conclusively that the electors of that province are more concerned about wider markets for their produce than they are about flag-waving. The Liberals under Mr. Walter Scott carried the day by a very large majority, almost making a clean sweep. It is conceded by both political parties that the main issue was wider markets, though Conservative newspapers and speakers have tried to make it appear that "reciprocity" became a dead issue after last September.

Globe reporter visited fifteen bakeries in Toronto a few days ago and found most of them in a filthy condition. The workmen wore dirty clothes, swarms of flies were in the shops feeding on the dough, and little attention was paid to the cleanliness of the premises. A newspaper is to be commended for exposing the proprietors of shops who show no regard for the laws of health, but the civic authorities are the ones to look into those unpleasant places.
