LONDON STREET PERILS.

Authorities Anxious Over Growing Number of Accidents.

The alarming increase in the number of street accidents in London, England, is attracting the attention of the authorities.

In 1881 there were 127 persons killed and 3,400 injured in the streets of London. Ten years later, while the horse still held undisputed sway, the numbers had grown to 147 and 5,837 respectively, a total increase in the year of 2,257 accidents.

With the advent of motor power the increase became more rapid. In 1901 there were 9,383 persons killed and injured. At the end of 1910 the number of accidents had more than doubled, the total number being 17,927.

Whereas at the beginning of the century the old horse cabs were running down between thirteen hundred and fourteen hundred persons a year and killing only a dozen or so, motor cabs to-day are killing between thirty and forty a year and injuring approximately 2,000.

The motor-omnibus is a greater peril still, for whereas the old horse-drawn vehicle killed twenty-two persons and injured 503 in 1901, the motor-omnibus to-day is the cause of more than a thousand accidents and is killing three times the number of its predecessor.

Horse-drawn carts, vans and carriages (exclusive of cabs and omnibuses) are still, however, sufficiently numerous to be the greatest source of danger, for they kill between eighty and ninety persons every year in London, and injure between four and five thousand.

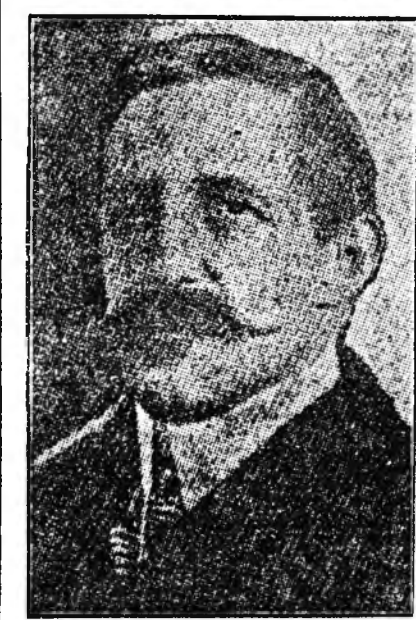

BRITAIN'S MERCHANT FLEET.

Comprises Practically One-half of World's Steam Tonnage.

An idea of the rapidity with which the sailing ship is disappearing is conveyed in figures given in the new volumes of "Lloyd's Register."

The world's sailing fleet now totals little more than 4,000,000 tons, whereas the merchant steamers of the globe are in excess of 40,000,000 tons. On the assumption that one ton of steam is equal to three of sail, steamships now do thirty times as much of the carrying trade of the world as sailing ships.

Of this huge total of steamshipping the British flag boasts practically one-half, as much as 17,700,000 tons being registered in the United Kingdom, and 1,600,000 tons in British colonies. It may be conjectured too that the British half comprises the newer and more economically worked moiety.

While 340,000 tons of shipping has been added to the United Kingdom register since 1911, Germany has increased her tonnage by 162,000, Japan by 141,000 and Norway by 138,000.

NEW GOVERNMENT BUILDING Magnificent Structure for Exhibits at Canadian National.

The new government building at the Canadian National Exhibition is being rushed to completion and will be ready for the year's Fair. It will cost \$160,000, of which the Dominion Government pays \$100,000, the Ontario Government \$25,000 and the City of Toronto the balance. It will be used for Provincial, Dominion and Educational Exhibits.

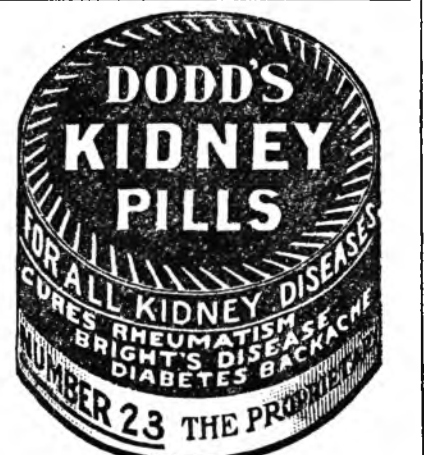
