**BOND LAKE**

The Metropolitan Railway Company are straightening their line in the vicinity of Bond Lake. Commencing at a point directly south of the Power House the hills will be cut down, the hollows and the west part of the Lake filled up with earth, the line to be run straight from the car barns to a point on Yonge street near Mr. Durham's gate. That part of the line east of Yonge street will be double-tracked, and a long platform to be erected for the convenience of visitors coming to the Park. The work will be expensive, necessitating the removal of several buildings, but will greatly improve the appearance of the Lake front, and add much to the accommodation.
