A number of public bodies have passed strong resolutions in disapproval of Judge Denton's verdict against Mr. St. Clair after the latter had circulated printed sheets exposing the Toronto police for their inability or refusal to keep the plays in some of the Toronto theatres within the bounds of respectability and desency. Judge Denton admitted that the evidence went to show that some of the performances were disgusting, and were unfit for the public to see and hear. It should be remembered, however, that His Honour was not trying the case of the theatres or of the police. Admitting that the plays complained of were as disgraceful as they could possibly be, the question was: "Was Mr. St. Clair justified in the eyes of the law and in the cause of morality to print and circulate that which was admitted to be unclean.?" In other words did the end justify the means? Judges do not make our laws. Their duty is to interpret them. The work of cleansing some of the plays yet remains. If the citizens of Toronto and the police have the desire it can be done.

Jack Johnson, the colored pugilist, is to be barred from sporting circles on account of his bad behavior and low habits. Considering the notori-Ety the heavy weight has earned for himself during the past few months, it is not surprising that those who key claim to even the smallest portion of Fespectability would be ashamed to in any way associate with him. There are other reasons however, why professional boxers wish to have the burly knocker out of the way. Jack Johnston's reputation is infamous, the business of prize-fighting is not creditable to any man, but people should be honest enough to admit that no white man in the world, as far as we know, is able to stand before him in a boxing contest.

Very little real damage was done in the village on hallowe'en. It is a pity, however, that nonsensical tricks are not stopped altogether. Why should citizens be forced year after year to hide their gates and other movable property, or have them carried away? And why should a constable have to be employed to walk the streets when decent people should be in their beds? If proper notice were given that those who interfered with other people's property, would be punished if found out, the foolish tricks could be easily stopped. Of course the excuse is "Everybody's Doing It."

The World was the only Toronto daily that expressed itself as being positive that Col. Roosevelt would be elected President of the United States on Tuesday. The result shows that even The World is not always infallible in its prognostications.
