

Hon. F. D. Monk has given his reason for resigning his position in the Borden Cabinet in these words:—"I resigned my place in the Cabinet because the Government had decided not to have a plebiscite on the naval question."

The Conservative press generally commend Mr. Monk for what they term his honorable course, but they do not seem to realize they are placing the Dominion Premier in an awkward position.

As Tuesday's Globe points out Hansard shows that on the 22nd of November, 1910, Mr. Monk moved an amendment to the address in the following terms:—

"The house regrets that the speech from the Throne gives no indication whatever of the intention of the Government to consult the people on its naval policy AND THE GENERAL QUESTION OF THE CONTRIBUTION OF CANADA TO IMPERIAL ARMAMENTS."

The above was a direct vote of censure on the Laurier Government because they did not propose to take a plebiscite on the naval question. Hon. R. L. Borden voted for Mr. Monk's amendment, but now that he is in power he declines to do what he insisted on when in opposition.

Rev. Dr. Hincks, who is now in England in the interest of the World's Evangelical Alliance to protest against the ne temere decree, is creating much enthusiasm. After an address in London Tuesday evening a resolution was carried expressing sympathy with the Protestants of Canada in their efforts to resist the Papal decree and to prevent its legal enforcement.

Sir Robert Perks, who followed Dr. Hincks, proposed the following resolution, which was adopted:—

"That as His Majesty's Government has taken no action to protect the civil and religious rights of His Majesty's subjects who contract legal marriages, this meeting calls upon the Imperial Parliament to take steps to give the necessary relief to those who, while lawfully married, are subjected to suffering in consequence of the terms of the decree ne temere."

Those who have signed the petition asking for the repeal of local option in Markham Township should not allow themselves to be deceived by the suggestion that only wine and beer licenses will be issued. Should the by-law be repealed those whose names are on the petition will have nothing to say as to what kind of licenses will be granted. That matter will lie solely with the license commissioners.

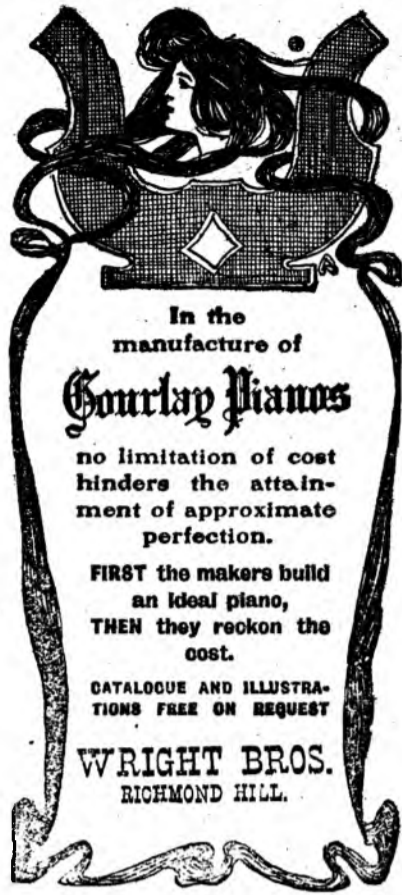
