

VOTE FOR BOTH BY-LAWS.

At the nomination meeting Monday evening the Village Clerk stated that the sum of \$561.69, which it is proposed to raise for 20 years by way of debentures will be less than the Council will be compelled to expend yearly for the improvement of roads and sidewalks. That being the case it behoves every voter to mark his and her ballots next Monday in favor of the by-law to raise \$7,000. A few thousand dollars expended judiciously next summer will greatly benefit business in the village.

Relative to the by-law to authorize an agreement for the supply of electric energy—which we are now enjoying—we believe if a ballot is marked against the by-law it will be by mistake.

By all means come out next Monday and vote for both by-laws.

VILLAGE NOMINATIONS.

A Public meeting to receive nominations for the position of reeve, councillors and P. S. trustees, was held in the Lorne Hall Monday evening. Last year's Council, and the three retiring members of the Board of Education were all elected by acclamation, no other nominations being made. Mr. A. J. Hume, village clerk, declared the following elected:—

Reeve—W. H. Pugsley.
Councillors—J. H. Sanderson, J. Tyndall, J. Palmer, G. S. Sims.
School Trustees—G. McDonald, G. Harding, W. A. Wright.

The clerk gave an explanation as to the various items of expenditure, showing that much of this expenditure is outside of the control of the Council.

The reeve, councillors and trustees with their movers and seconders made short speeches, and there was practically no fault found with our village guardians.

The general opinion seemed to be that our village fathers, though cautious, are alive to the interests of this municipality. Many referred with pleasure to the electric light which had just been turned on, and the opinion was general that the rate-payers next Monday should give rousing majorities in favor of both by-laws—the one to authorize a contract with the Toronto & York Radial Company for a supply of electric energy; the other to raise \$7,000 by way of debentures for the purpose of repairing and improving the roadways and sidewalks in our village.
