



Steeplejack's New Feat.

Mr. W. Larkins, the London (England) steeplejack who climbed the Nelson Column and restored the statue in 1905, the centenary of Trafalgar, has been engaged to repair the monument of the first Duke of Sutherland, near Dunrobin Castle. The journey from London is 652 miles, and the monument stands on the summit of Ben Vraggie, 1,300 feet high. The statue itself stands on a solid stone pedestal 90 feet high, and measures 33 feet in height, nearly twice the size of the statue of Nelson in Trafalgar Square. It takes two hours to climb the mountain, and work has to cease in time for the descent before dark, the top of the mountain being covered with snow nearly all the winter.


