





#### To Aid China Agriculturists.

The republic of China has established a department of agriculture and forestry on modern lines, and this institution has begun publishing an agricultural journal (all in Chinese), which appears three times a month. It is understood that a national meteorological service will be established as a branch of this department, and that it will be under the direction of Dr. Hing Kwai Fung, who was educated at Cornell University, and who for the year past has been attached to the bureau of plant industry in Washington as an agricultural expert. Dr. Fung has started for China by way of Europe, where he will make a round of visits to meteorological observatories.
