PRACTICAL TRAINING.

A British Under-Secretary Was Once a Stone Mason.

The training that the late Henry Broadhurst, former Under-Secre-tary of the Home Department in Great Britain, and for many years a leading member of the House of Commons, received in his youth, was certainly not of a Parliamentary nature. Yet, as this story shows, he knew how to turn it to good account.

The son of a stone-mason, Broad hurst followed his father's trade until his thirty-second year, although he occasionally worked as a blacksmith. But during this period of his life he gave evidence of such ability that he was placed in several important offices of trust. He was elected to Parliament in 1880, and six years later Gladstone persuaded him to become Under-Secretary of the Home Department. For a long time Broadhurst refused the post, for he feared that his lack of education might create prejudice against him. Even after he had entered upon his duties, he found it necessary to absent himself from court, for the simple reason that he did not own the proper clothes.

In spite of these handicaps, Broadhurst quickly made his way to the top. Once, in a parliamentary debate that dealt with Oxford University, Broadhurst displayed such intimacy with the university and its buildings, that some one asked him whether he was a graduate of Oxford.

"No," answered Broadhurst, smiling, "but I often had chimneys to repair there."


