Sir James was on his feet in an instant and wanted it to be distinctly understood that no hand-clapping or demonstration of any kind would be tolerated from the visitors of the House.

The question asked is: Will the temperance party which supported Mr. Rowell's Abolish the Bar policy in Massey Hall a week or two ago, go back on him on election day? Time will tell. Mr. Rowell is advocating almost to the letter the policy of the Dominion Alliance for many years past. If they do not support him now it will show conclusively that they are prepared to sink their temperance principles on account of party politics.
