FATAL ACCIDENT.

Mr. Leonard Hutchinson, 36 years of age, only son of Mr. J. W. Hutch-inson, one mile south of Aurora, met sudden death Friday last about 2.30 p. m. The pulley of a chopping mach-ine broke, and a fragment of the wheel struck him on the forehead. Two doc-tors were speedily summoned, but the victim of the terrible accident never regained consciousness. and died two regained consciousness, and died two hours later. Deceased is survived by a widow and two sons. The funeral from the family residence, Hillcrest Farm, on Monday, was one of the largest ever seen in this section of country, and the sad occurrence cast a gloom over the community.
