

THAT \$5,000 LOAN.

It behoves our citizens to read carefully the by-law on another page proposing to loan Mr. W. J. Lawrence \$5,000 for a term of ten years, to aid him in the rebuilding of his greenhouse which was greatly damaged by recent windstorms. It will be seen that the sum required to be raised each year for ten years is \$663.34, amounting to \$6633.40. As \$5,000 is to be paid back in six annual installments the sum actually paid will be \$1633.40.

The security to be given the corporation is gilt edged, being a first mortgage on the whole plant, consisting of greenhouses, boiler house, fittings, &c., together with 6½ acres of land occupied by and attached to the same.

The question should be "is the greenhouse worth \$1633.40 to this village?" It would be hardly honest to say "yes we want the new industry, but we need not pay anything for it as the proprietor will rebuild anyway." So far we have been practically free from bonuses. That would not be a good reason for saying we shall not depart from that rule. Our two neighboring towns to the north—Aurora and Newmarket—have given a number of bonuses to industries in recent years. No person thinks those towns would have made the same progress had the bonuses been withheld.

It is well to be cautious, but it generally pays to be generous to those who are in a position to help our town along.

In spite of the fact that the Government was given every opportunity to bring in a real measure of tax reform this year they have failed to do so, and the agitation for relief will have to continue as before. The only changes agreed to by the Government are those decided upon in the Special Committee, providing a higher exemption for incomes. The chief issue however of giving Municipalities local option to tax improvements less than land has not been touched and the Opposition is still on the warpath for the reforms which have been so widely demanded both in the cities and country districts of the province.

Hon Adam Beck's Bill to encourage Municipalities to build electric radials is an important piece of legislation. Mr. N. W. Rowell speaking for the Opposition which has urged such a scheme all session congratulated the minister of power on his Bill. No Government funds will be spent directly on the project. The cost is to be met by the Municipalities from debentures. The railways will be allowed to use the Hydro right of way and by buying the Hydro current would be freed from any danger of exorbitant rates.
