BRYAN'S CRUELTY?

That well known society paper, Saturday Night, in its last number, takes Secretary of State Mr. J. Bryan to task for not furnishing intoxicating drinks at the state dinners at Washington. Saturday night says:—"Of course Mr. Bryan in his private capacity has every right in the world to drink water or red ink with his meals if he so desires, but Mr. Bryan, Secretary of State of the United States of America, has no right to afflict other people, particularly as these other people, diplomats and foreign visitors, are attending Mr. Bryan's dinners not because they want to, but because it is a part of their routine business as members of the diplomatic corps. "Mr. Bryan and the rest of his ilk should remember that while ginger pop may be a healthy enough beverage, diplomats have not been brought up on it, and that in insisting on such procedure he is only making himself and his country ridiculous."

Saturday Night seems to think that the chief function of diplomats and foreign visitors is to smoke cigars and drink champagne.

The prize fight in Calgary last Sunday resulted in the death of Luther McCarty who received a fatal blow from his opponent Arthur Pelkey. In two minutes after the fight had begun. Shortly after the fight had begun Pelkey was arrested and will doubtless be tried for manslaughter. It cannot be claimed that Pelkey is free from blame yet the real responsibility of the man-killing should be placed on the shoulders of the Calgary authorities who allowed the fight to take place. There is no reason to think that these two men engaged in combat tried to kill each other, any more than prize fighters always do. Under such circumstances fighters are not supposed to give their opponents love taps. If the recent encounter would put an end to all prize fights in Canada it would add greatly to the good name of this country.

Toronto did itself credit in suppressing "Deborah," a theatrical performance which is pronounced immoral. Many plays furnish wholesome entertainment, others are doubtful, while others again are decidedly evil in their tendencies. Playacting may be made to do a good work for both old and young, but the performances should be such that respectable men and women can attend without a fear that they may have to hide their faces in shame.

Hon. W. J. Hanna, Provincial Secretary, has ordered that all the bars on Manitoulin Island be closed on and after the first of August. The Scott act was carried on the Island a few months ago, but by a technicality the License Commissioners recommended that the licenses be granted another year. Mr. Hanna was certainly right in not allowing a technicality to stand in the way of closing the bars.
