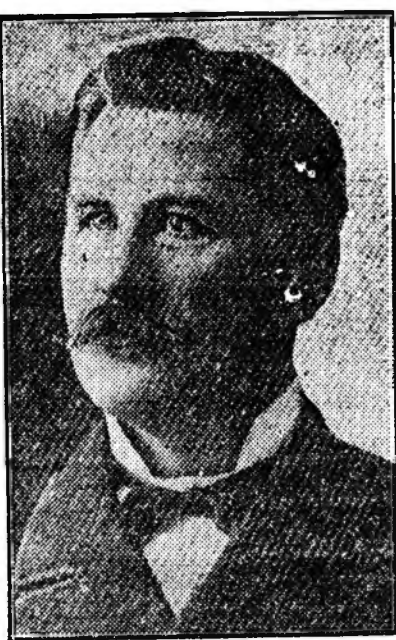
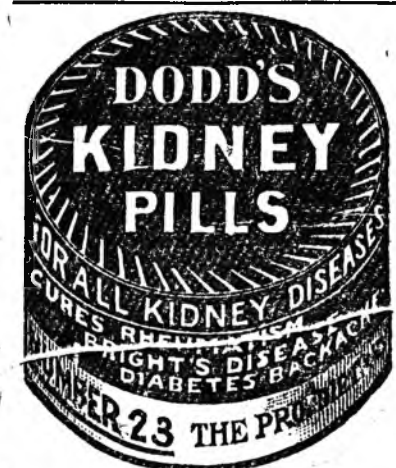
Regretting the Cost.
