A by-election will take place in East York on the 8th of September, the present member for the Local House having been appointed Sheriff for York County, to succeed the late Sheriff Daville.

At present it looks as if the Conservative nomination would be tendered to either Mr. W. H. Pugsley, Reeve of Richmond Hill, or Mr. G. Henry, an ex-Reeve of York Township. It will be remembered that Mr. Pugsley made an excellent run a few years ago in Centre York, being defeated by only a few votes by the late Senator Campbell.

MARKHAM TOWNSHIP COUNCIL.

Council met at Unionville on Monday, Aug. 4, with all the members present and Reeve Nigh in the chair. Communications were received from Supt. Clark of Toronto General Hospital stating that Geo. McLean a resident of Thornhill had been sent to the hospital by Dr. C. P. Johns of Thornhill.

Mr. M. Kenzie was appointed a commissioner to repair or build a new culvert between lots 20 and 21, con. 5.

A by-law was passed to levy rates and collect taxes for the current year, with the blanks filled as follows:—

Gen. and Industrial Home purposes and Court House Debitures, \$3972.76; rate 2.15 mills.

Good Roads Debiture and Interest \$2388.73; rate .57 mills.

Township purposes, \$10,503.25; rate 2.50 mills.

Unionville Police Village, \$363.90; rate 4.00 mills.

Mount Joy Police Village, \$356.35; rate 4.00.

A large number of road accounts and general accounts were ordered to be paid.

A by-law was passed appointing tax collectors for 1913 and blanks filled as follows:—West Hill, W. F. Nichols; East Hill, Wm. Pingle. Collectors to give sureties for \$20,000 each.

Padget-Reeser—That the clerk be and is hereby authorized to pay to the Treasurer of the Markham Agricultural Society the sum of \$50 to be applied towards improving the grounds.

Council adjourned to meet on Monday, Sept. 1st, at 1 p.m.

GLOVER DID NOT APPEAR

Charles Glover was up again before T. H. Brunton, Police Magistrate, on Saturday, charged with indulging in strong drink while on the prohibited list. The charge was amended to that of being intoxicated in a public place. The defendant did not appear, but evidence was taken in his absence. T. Burns, T. Allison, W. Harding and G. Symes, stated that defendant was worse of liquor in the Palmer House, and J. Glass and E. Grainger who saw him in the street with a bottle thought he was intoxicated. The Magistrate did not enter a conviction as he said there was a late possibility that the defendant might have been detained, but he adjourned the case, and ordered a warrant issued for his arrest in case he can be found.
