

Chinese Burned Opium.

Opium worth \$60,000 was burned in front of the Nankai Middle. School, in the native city, Tien-Tsin, China, recently. Nine great pots were filled with the drug. The students of the school and at least three thousand other spectators cheered when the big cauldrons were set afire shortly after noon. Among the onlookers were more than one hundred foreign soldiers and their officers, to whom the enthusiasm of the Chinese as the drug went up in smoke was a revelation.
