## BY-LAW No.\_

To provide, by way of debentures, for the cost of extensions to the Richmond Hill Municipal Electric Light System, including House lighting and power systems.

Whereas there has been installed in the Village of Richmond Hill a system of House lighting by electricity and also of supplying power for electric motors, and whereas the cost of said house lighting and power systems is over and above the cost of the original plant for street lighting, and Whereas it is necessary to raise a

sufficient amount of money to defray the said cost of said extensions, and

Whereas the sum of \$4000 is required to defray the said cost, and the said sum of \$4000 is the amount of the debt intended to be created by this By-law,

whereas, it is expedient to issue de-Whereas, it is expedient to issue debentures of the Corporation in order to provide for the said debt, to the amount of \$4000 bearing interest at the rate of 51 per cent per annum, and Whereas, it will require the sum of \$334.72 to be raised annually by a special rate on the whole rateable property in the said Village for the paying of the said debt and interest;

Now, therefore, the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Richmond Hill enacts as follows,—

1st, That the Reeve of the Corpora-

1st, That the Reeve of the Corpora-tion of the Village of Richmond Hill be and he is hereby authorized to ber-row the said sum of \$4000 on the credit of the Corporation for the purpose aforesaid, and to issue debentures of the said Corporation for the sum of \$4000 payable at the office of the Treasurer of the said Village.

Within the period of 20 years there shall be raised and levied annually by a special rate, in addition to all other rates the yearly sum of \$334.72 for the payment of the said debt and

interest.
Srd, The said debentures shall bear date as of the 1st day of March, 1914, and shall be signed by the Reeve and Treasurer and sealed with the seal of the said Corporation.

4th, This By-law shall come into operation and be of full force and effect on the date of the final passing

thereof.

5th, That the votes of the electors of this Municipality who are entitled to vote on this By-law shall be taken on the 5th day of January, 1914, commencing at nine o'clock in the morning and closing at five o'clock in the afternoon in the Council Chamber in the said Village of Richmond Hill. the said Village of Richmond Hill.
