Relative to an extesinon of the franchise for women Hon. Mr. Lucas, speaking for the Government, contended that the time was not oppor. tune for the measure, and Hon. Mr. Hanna in refusing the second reading of the bill to close the bars expressed the opinion that public sentiment was not far enough advanced to pass such a measure.


