The laconic statement handed out by General Lessard in dismissing a number of men from the concentration camp shows that the volunteers are in good hands. The General declared that Canadian troops should be "soldiers and gentlemen."

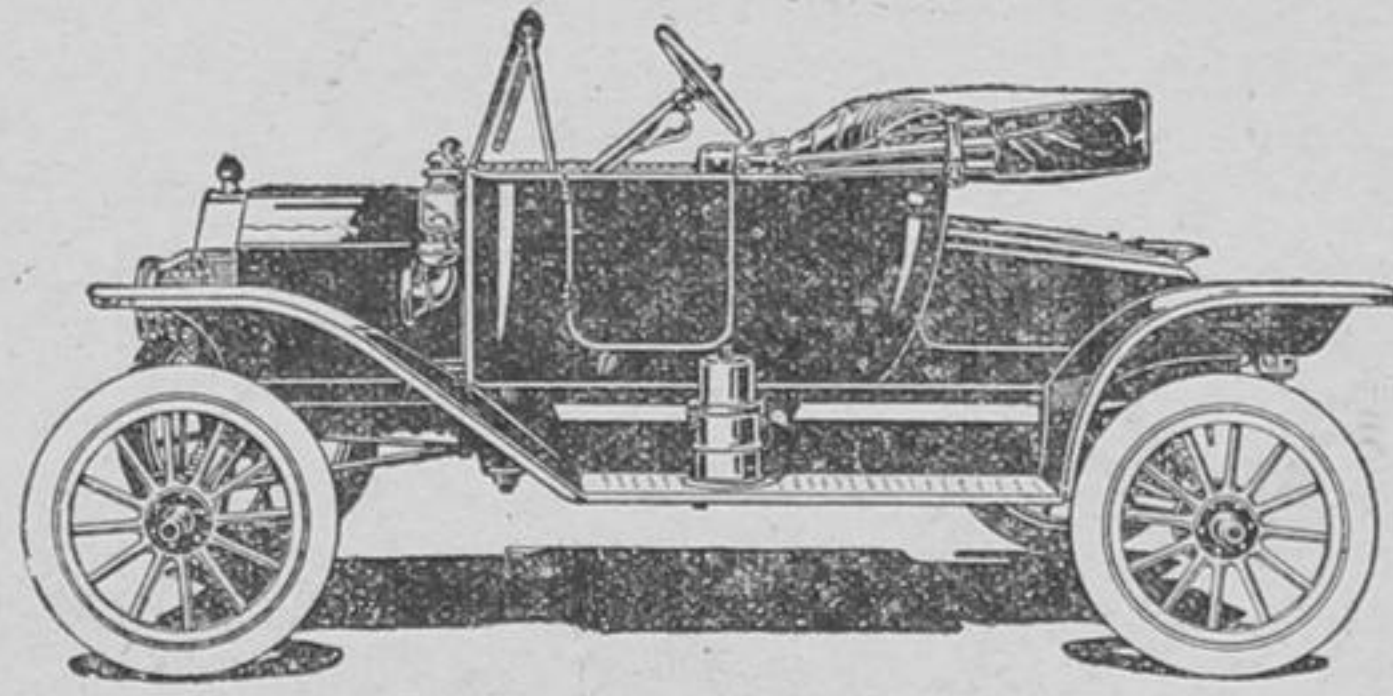
