ANNUAL SEED FAIR

The annual Seed Fair in connection with the Richmond Hill Agricultural Society, held in the Lorne Hall last Saturday was successful both in attendance, and the quality and quantity of the exhibits. The hall was crowded in the afternoon, and the addresses and suggestions were both practical and interesting.

The principal address was given by Mr. Scarf the Government representative who spoke on the necessity of farmers sowing clean seed even if this necessitated hand picking.

The president, Mr. J. N. Breakey, who occupied the chair, called on several gentlemen in the audience, and brought forth practical remarks from Messrs. J. Lunan, W. H. Clubine, W. H. Pugsley, J. McLean, F. A. Legge, W. Thompson, E. Clark, T. Stephens, R. F. Boynton and others.

The secretary, Mr. Nicholls, pointed out that the exhibits were more numerous than at any previous Seed Fair. He congratulated the Society on the Seed Fair, although financially, it was carried on at a loss.

Mr. J. C. Steckley, District Representative, for the Ontario Government, also gave a cheery address in which he stated that next year he hoped to make Richmond Hill the centre for a six week's course.

Before closing, a vote of thanks, moved by Mr. Clubine and Mr. Lunan, was tendered Mr. Keith who acted as judge.

ENGLAND TO-DAY

Conditions in War Time

The above is the timely topic on which a patriotic Lecture, illustrated by eighty English and War pictures, through the electric lantern, is to be given in the Masenic Hall, Richmond Hill, on Saturday evening next, the 20th inst. The lecturer is Mr. H. J. Osborn, who is recently from London, England, was on the European continent when war began, and from long experience of public affairs, and intimate knowledge of men and measures in the Old Country, is specially well able to give sound, reliable, and up-to-date information.

Mr. Osborn is a journalist, as well as a lecturer, and is a special correspondent of over one hundred British newspapers. The lecture is, therefore, likely to be an authoritative detail from a well informed and capable speaker, and deeply interesting, both in matter and illustration. During his short stay so far in Canada (he is on a fifth visit). Mr. Osborn has spoken in over forty places in Ontario, he is very favorably reported in the press of Ottawa, Kingston, Peterboro, Hamilton, Brantford, Welland, Orillia and numerous other places. Sir Hamer Greenwood Bart, the brilliant member of the British Parliament says: "H. J. Osborn has travelled widely, and is perfectly sound and well informed on all the questions of the day."
