FARM HANDS

The Employment agent at Richmond Hill has received a circular letter from the Superintendent of Immigration at Ottawa pointing out that immigration from the British Isles this year will be light, and consequently, farmers are now confronted with the necessity of securing help from some other source.

The following paragraph is taken from a circular:—

"There are a large number of idle men in Canada, some of whom have had experience as farm labourers. This is the only source of supply for the present year. As farmers everywhere are making a strong effort to increase production in view of war prices and the desirability of Canada raising as much as possible to meet the needs of the Empire in this crisis, I think it likely that farm help will be scarce before long and therefore farmers should take immediate advantage of the present situation to secure help before the rush begins and the scarcity of labour is felt. We have a special agent at the Union Depot, Toronto (Mr. Wm. Banford) who is seeking to send men out to farms, and I would suggest that you urge upon the farmers of your district the desirability of placing their applications with you at once."

We shall be pleased to assist the farmers, through Mr. Banford, to secure the required help.

SWINE HUSBANDRY IN CANADA

is the title of Bulletin No. 17 of the Live Stock Branch of the Department of Agriculture at Ottawa. This publication describes the bacon hog and discusses his breeding and rearing.

The breeds of swine reared in Canada are described and a history of each is given. An interesting section is devoted to the production of pork on Canadian farms. The information was evidently secured from practical farmers in cheese factory and in creamery districts and in sections where hogs are raised without dairy by-products.

The bulletin concludes with articles on hog cholera and tuberculosis, written by the Veterinary Director General and the Chief Meat Inspector, respectively. This bulletin is generously illustrated and printed in sepia brown ink. Copies are available to those who apply for them to the Publications Branch of the Department of Agriculture at Ottawa.
