HOCKEY AND BANQUET

The North Toronto Broadview High School hockey teams, senior and junior, played the first of the home and home games with the Richmond Hill high school players in the local rink on Friday evening last. The visiting teams in a special car were accompanied by a large number of students including ladies. Both games were well contested. The match between the senior teams was a good exhibition of fast hockey. The playing was more even than the score indicated. Richmond Hill senior team scored two goals in the first half time and notched up three in second half making the score 5-0. The game between the second teams ended also in favour of the locals with score 3-0. Our senior team is playing good hockey, having played in all five matches, this season, winning all, scoring 29 goals to their opponents 5, a most creditable record. The return games with North Toronto will be played shortly which will close the series for this season.

After the games a banquet was given the visitors by the Richmond Hill High School students at the Rustic Inn where upwards of a hundred from both Schools sat down to tables beautifully decorated with flowers and patriotic symbols, the gift of the genial host and hostess, Mr. and Mrs. Wigmore. Following the refreshments, a programme with the usual toasts were responded to with Principal Davidson in the chair.

On the chairman's right was an ex-principal of the high school Mr. Shaw B.A., now on Broadview high school staff, and well known to Richmond Hill people. Mr. Shaw in the course of an excellent address which was partly patriotic and partly reminiscent complimented Richmond Hill high school on its present prosperous condition, and its fine hockey team. A feature of the entertainment was the singing of patriotic songs interspersed with the patriotic toasts by the high school girls assisted by Mrs. Davidson who also aided in making the event a really sociable one, Miss Grace Pratt ably presided at the piano. About 12 o'clock, an evening greatly enjoyed by the students and teachers, ended with the singing of the national anthem and all dispersed happy at this first social gathering of the two high schools.
