RICHMOND HILL FAIR

A Great Success

Large Attendance

Richmond Hill has had many successful fairs, but none more successful than the 66th held on Monday. The weather was perfect, the exhibits were numerous, and the attendance was larger than at any previous exhibition. The gate receipts were nearly \$900, therefore the attendance, including children and guests, must have been nearly 5,000. At the entertainment in the evening, by the Parker Dramatic Company of Toronto, the proceeds amounting to \$220. A good program of music was furnished by Malvern Land during the afternoon. The Metropolitan furnished a good service and large numbers arrived in automobiles and carriages. The "Jitney to Richmond Hill" was also much in evidence.

The exhibits in fine arts and ladies' work in Agricultural Hall were creditable, and the cattle, poultry and other departments had many spectators. And in both heavy and light horses it would be difficult to find a more excellent class of animals anywhere. Probably no other exhibit in the grounds had as many admirers as Mr. Wm. Britnell's team of cart horses.

The football, the horse racing and the foot racing were enjoyable features, but it was felt that there would have been time for a few more athletic sports, and also a free-for-all trotting race. The farmers' trot was won by Maple Boy, Barrie Boy taking second, and Sandy Mair third. The refreshment booths were well patronized, the High School Alumnae, for the Red Cross Society, taking in \$175.

The Eckardt Cup for best single lady driver was awarded to Miss Wood of Hagerman, and Mrs. M. Patton of Elgin Mills was awarded the silver mounted butter cooler presented by Capt. Adams. For best Jersey cow Charles Cooper was presented with a shield, and in Durham cattle a prominent winner was T. Thompson. J. McNair was a winner in grades, and F. Legge in Holsteins. Wright Bros. took first for carriage team, and for single roadster W. Comisky was given first place.
