Her Only Son

Many boys and girls here will remember Herbert Vivian, who spent much of his time when a little boy here with his grandparents, Mrs. and Mrs. R. E. Law. He enlisted with the Sixth Regiment Duke of Cornwall's Own Rifles, but was killed in action. The Herald, B.C. in referring to the sad event, says: "He was born in Brantford, but when he was about a month old his father died suddenly. His mother then moved to Toronto, where they resided until coming to Peachland. Here he attended the public and high schools until about three years ago, when he and his mother moved to Vancouver. He enlisted with the first contingent and was among the first to lay down his life for his country. Great sympathy is felt here for his mother who has made such a sacrifice. Herbert, as a boy, was very popular among his youthful associates here." Many friends in Richmond Hill will join in sincere sympathy for the widow in the loss of her only son.

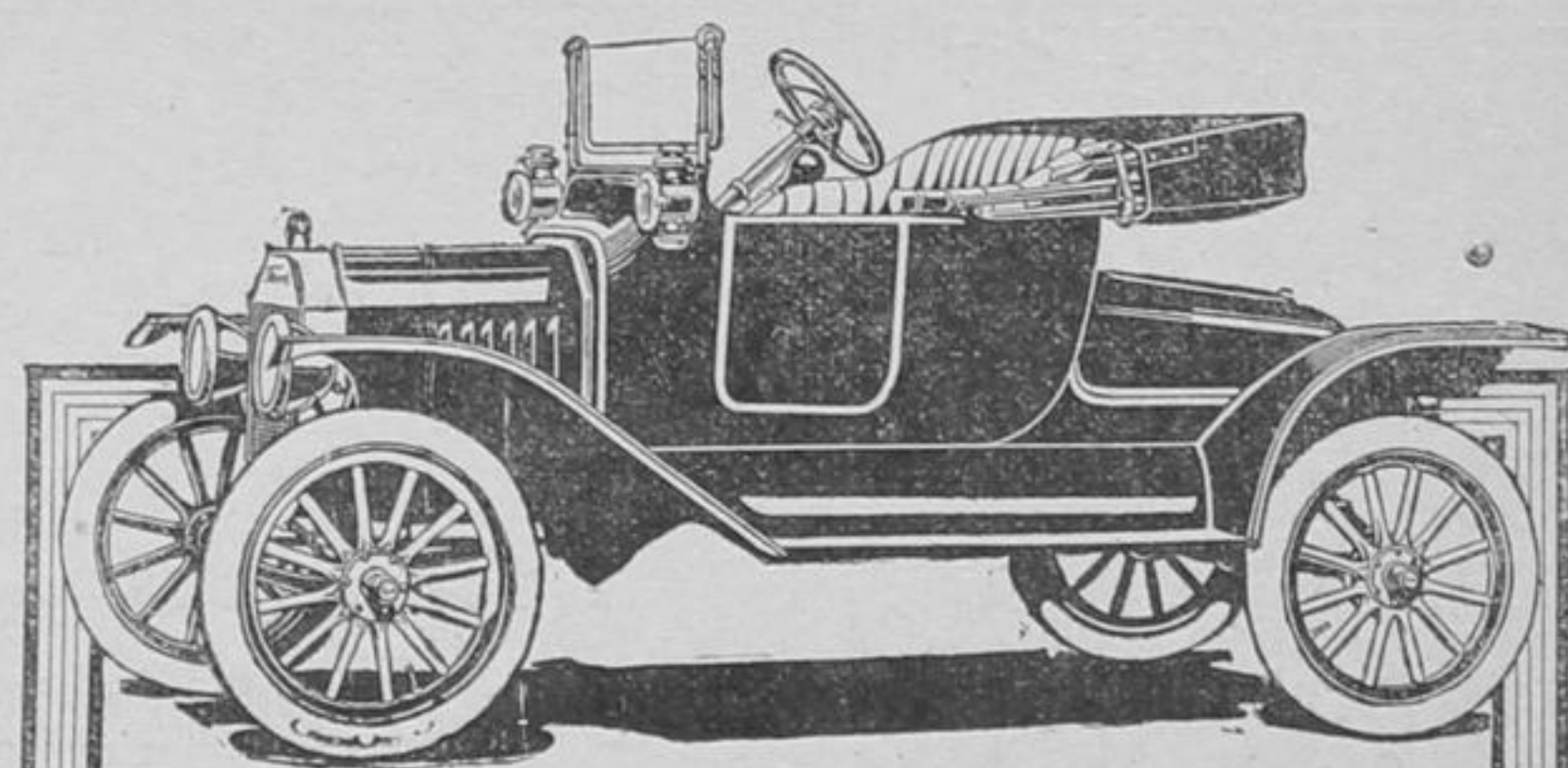

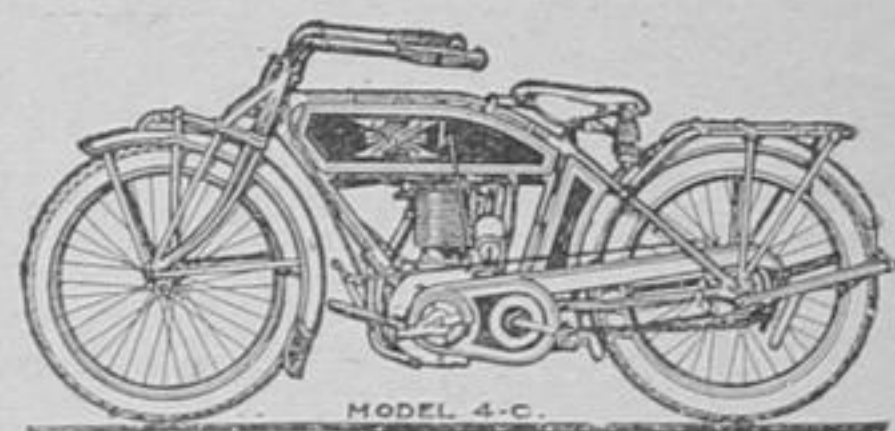
