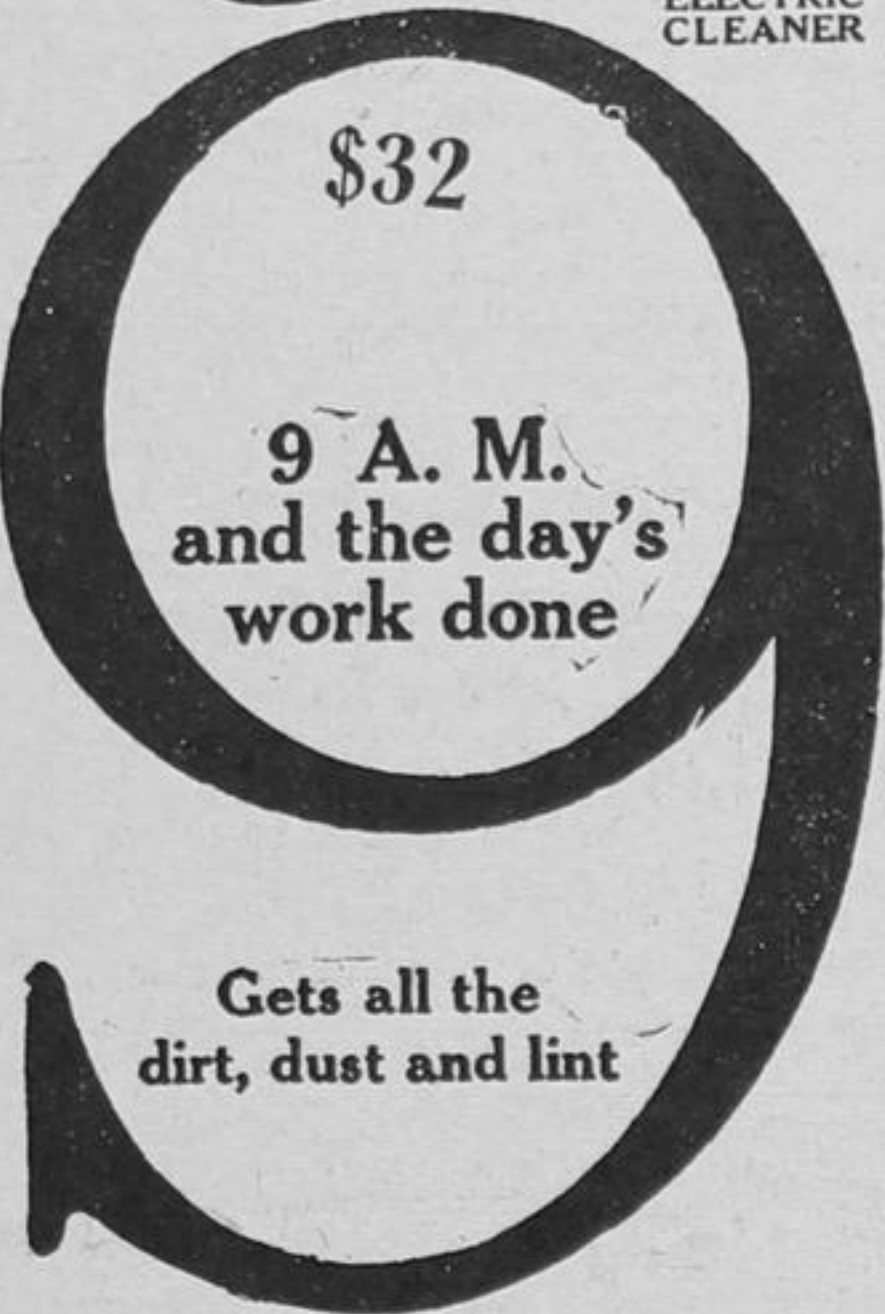

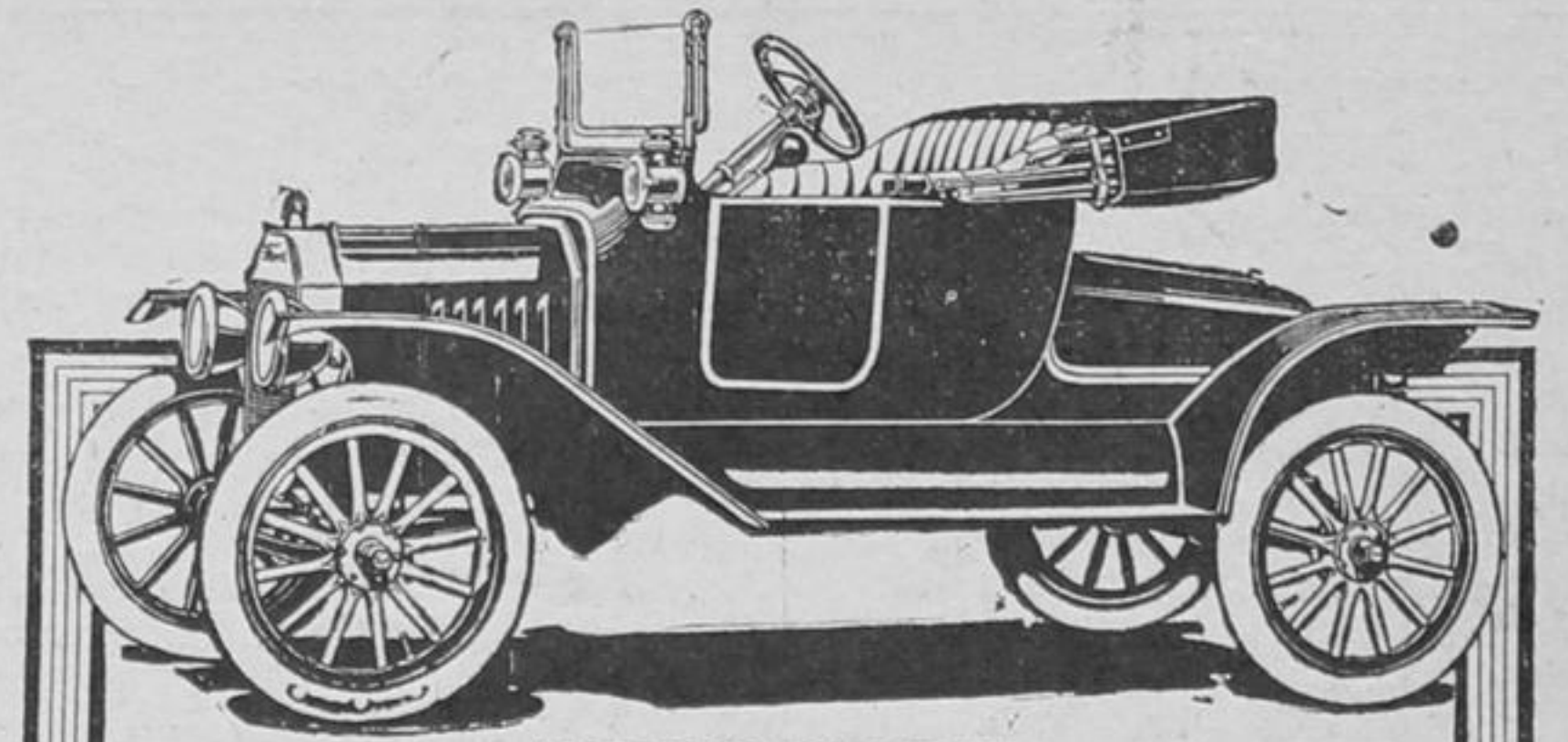
Court of Revision
