ENLIST, YOUNG MAN

It now seems almost certain that no General Election will be held in Canada during the present war. Premier Borden has so far made no announcement, but the presence of Liberal and Conservative leaders on the same platform is an indication that our political parties feel they are better employed in pleading for recruits in the cause of liberty, than in party warfare which endangers friendship and good-will among the people.

A few nights ago Sir Wilfrid Laurier and Hon. Martin Burrell delivered addresses in Ottawa from the same platform, and it is hoped that many such appeals will be made in all parts of the country. "Conscription" seems a hard word. We believe if the matter is fairly presented there are thousands of young men in Canada ready to take up arms in defence of their King and Empire. It is true that those who go to the front are risking their lives, but those who are in a position to go, and refuse the privilege, should hesitate before again waving the old flag, and singing "God Save the King."

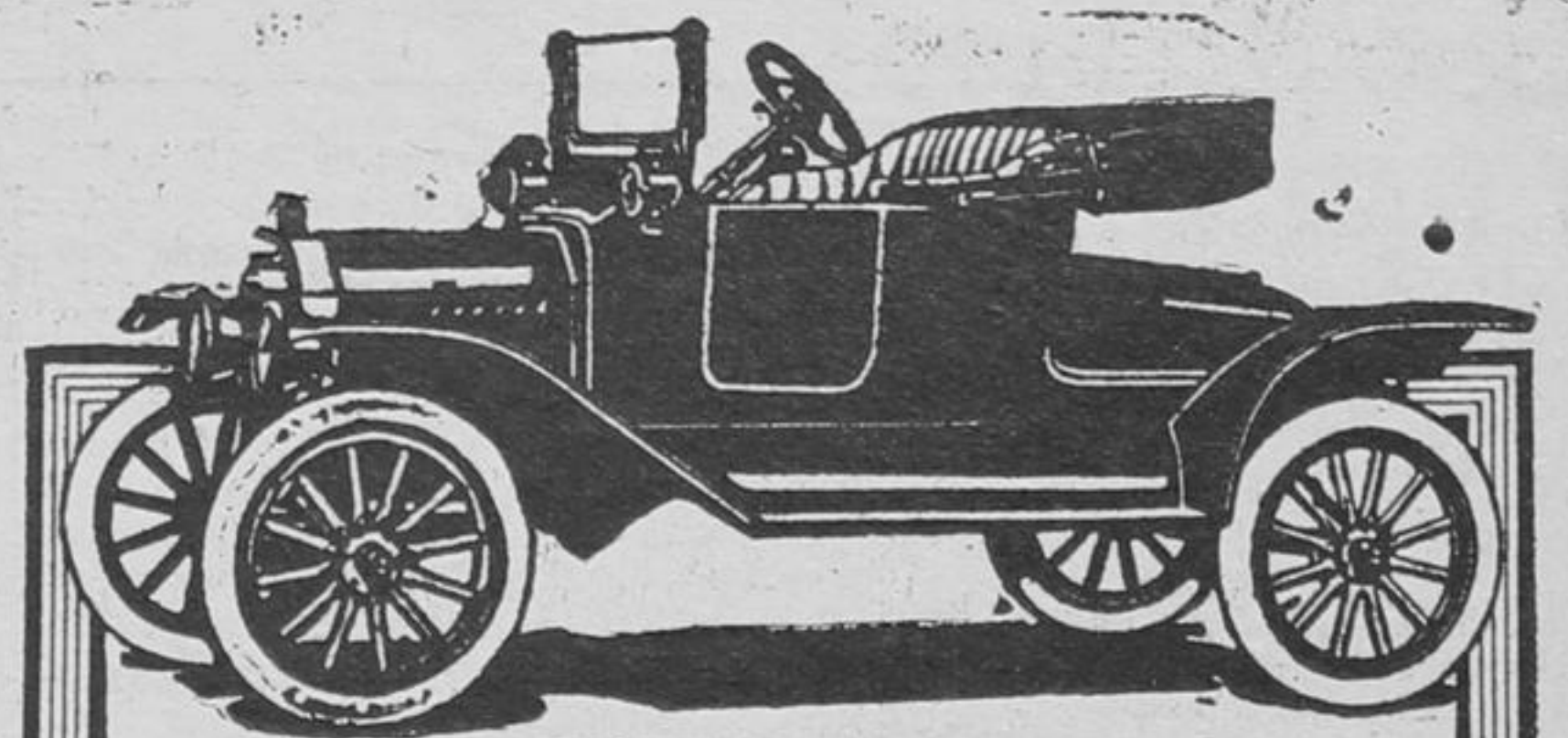

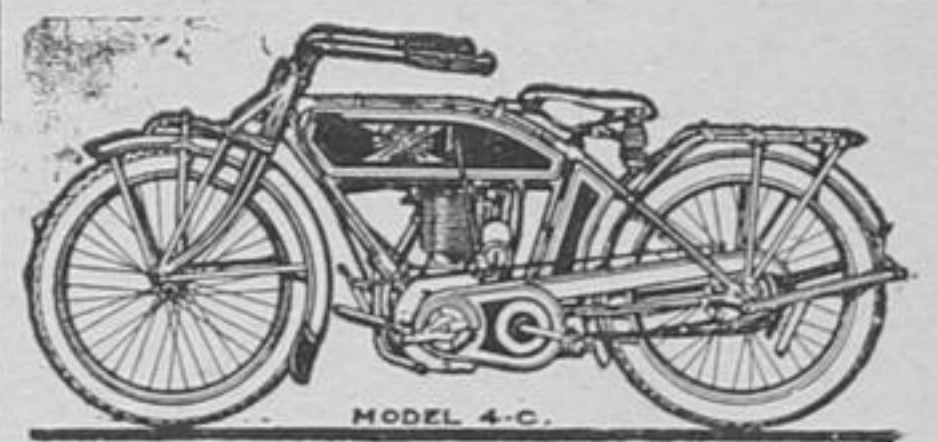
