THE 2,000 FEET GAP

The closing paragraph of an editorial in Tuesday's World shows that that paper is getting tired of backing up the Toronto City Council in its foolish tactics in tearing up the part of the Metropolitan Railway south of Farnham avenue. But although the Ontario Railway Board has ordered that the tracks be re-laid at once The World supports the City Council in asking for an appeal to the Privy Council.

The World admits the seriousness of the situation in compelling thousands of people to walk over the gap every day, but tries to excuse Mayor Church and his colleagues from entering into an agreement with the Metropolitan because there is a "suspicion" that the latter cannot be trusted.

"Unfortunately the man who has to walk 1400 feet, the woman who has to carry a baby that distance, citizens generally who have to plow through mud and rain from one car to the other and climb the hill to go north, do not care whose fault it is. They want the service. The city should is make it clear whose fault it is that they do not get it."

The fact of the matter is, neither Mayor Church nor the Toronto newspapers can show that the city is not The Peace Patent at fault in the absurd and almost intolerable state of affairs at the southern end of Yonge street.






