# THE STANDARD BANK OF CA

HE 41st Annual Meeting of the Shareholders of the Standard Bank of Canada was held at the Head Office of the Bank, 15 King St. West, Toronto, on Wednesday, the 23rd of February, 1916. (sub. to Trenton), and in Toronto, Bathurst St., opposite Arthur St.; Eglinton, No. 2451 Yonge St., and closed at Consecon, Ont.; Crescent Heights (sub. to Calgary, Alta.), Dunsford (sub. to Lindsay), Hamilton Mountain (sub. branch), Locust Hill, Ont. (sub. to Markham), Malvern, Ont. (sub. to Markham.) The number of branches now open is 121.

During the year the Bank subscribed to the Dominion War Loan for \$1,000,000, and was allotted \$857,800, on account of its subscription.

The usual inspection of the Branches has been carefully made during the year and it affords me pleasure to record the zeal and efficiency of the staff. The auditor, Mr. Geoffrey T. Clarkson, of the firm of Clarkson, Gordon & Dilworth, Toronto, whose report is appended, is eligible for re-election as auditor for the ensuing year.
