### A TIME TO PLAY

Such questions as the following are often asked: "Why does not Mr. Thompson keep a sharper lookout for boys in the Village who show a disposition to be troublesome?"

We believe the conduct of the children in Richmond Hill compares favorably with that in other places, but those of our citizens who keep their eyes open must observe that there are times when a word from some person in authority would have a salutary effect.

It is only fair to Mr. Thompson, however, to point out that he is not a village constable, and does not receive any salary from this municipality, as a constable. This newspaper has long contended that a small salary paid for a Village Constable would be money well spent. It has been frequently remarked that there is little pleasure for men and women at garden parties or lawn socials from the fact that boys and girls are allowed to yell and shout, and run helter-skelter, pushing and shoving each other in great confusion. At the last open air concert in the Park it was remarked that it was difficult to distinguish the selections by the Band on account of the noise made by the children.

It is nice to see children enjoy themselves, but there is a time even for play.

James A. Norris, President of the Toronto Conservative Association, has been nominated by the Conservative party as a candidate. Mr. Norris made a strong bid for the support of the liquor interests in his nomination speech, in which he stated that he was not in accord with the Government policy on prohibition, and that he would use his influence to have a beer and wine license proposition submitted with the referendum; and that he would endeavor to make it possible for the laboring man, who could not afford to buy a case of beer, to get his glass of lager in the meantime.

Mr. Rowell, the Liberal leader, who is at present in France, cabled his deep regret at the distressing loss of life occasioned in the recent fires, and expressed a desire to co-operate with the Government in relief measures.

It is unofficially announced that the manufacture of nickel in Canada is to begin as soon as the necessary arrangements can be made and the plant provided by the International Nickel Co. A deputation from North Bay waited upon Hon. G. Howard Ferguson on Thursday last with the object of securing the assistance of the Minister of Mines in having the proposed refining plant situated at North Bay. Mr. Ferguson recently made public the fact that the Government is examining into a special process whereby nickel can be refined in Ontario. In reply to enquiries he stated that it is not the intention of the Ontario Government to go into the nickel refining business themselves; that a process enabling nickel to be refined in Ontario was being worked out; and that the nickel companies would be compelled to use this process and use it in Ontario. Royalties would be charged and revenue thus secured for the province.
