**Letter From the West.**

From H. R. Heise.

(Continued.)

Oct. 12—After being delayed five  
days with rain and five days with  
snow we now have the threshing out-  
fit running steady, twelve hours a day.  
The outfit consists of engine, separator,  
coal wagon, water tank, cook car,  
sleeping car, eight stook wagons,  
eighteen men and the cook. After  
threshing forty acres, yielding 38  
bushels per acre, and taking one load  
to town, which brought \$119, so as to  
have a little spending money, Bro.  
Baker is threshing for a few of the  
neighbors before finishing his own.  
He charges \$20 an hour when the  
grain turns out poor, and 8c. per bush.  
for oats and 12c. for wheat when it  
turns out good. He says his expenses  
are \$140 per day. We have three  
binders cutting flax now in a 315 acre  
patch, cutting about 70 acres per day.  
The yield will not be very good, as  
there was a hard frost on Sept. 14,  
which greatly injured it. The flax  
straw is very stiff, and was not broken  
down with the six inches of snow  
that fell last week. The price is \$2.25  
per bushel now at Winnipeg, and  
wheat \$1.65, so the prospects are very  
good here, as a good many farmers are  
getting 40 bush. per acre of wheat,  
and 12 bushels of flax. If the fine  
weather continues for one month the  
threshing will be pretty well done, as  
there are a great many machines  
working, some outfits have a stook  
loader. They are run with four horses,  
and elevate the staves right unto the  
wagon. I am told they can put on a  
load in one minute. That saves four  
men and wagons. In cutting the flax  
we take off the packers and knoter,  
and put on a flax attachment which  
leaves it in bundles. In threshing it  
the machine will take it as fast as  
four men can pitch it in.
