As those European countries are crowded with women, however, it behoves those who feel it their duty to be there, to consider the matter well. There is every reason to think that our wounded Canadian boys and men are being well cared for, and the advice which has time and again come from headquarters is to remain at home and do all the work they can here.

Cards have been sent out recently to newspaper publishers asking the question: "Will you accept Liquor Advertising." As the Ontario Legislature has passed an Act closing the bars and liquor stores during the continuance of the war, no doubt many newspapers will decline the offer.

Saskatchewan has taken another forward step along temperance lines. On Monday, by a majority of about 10 to 1, that Province voted to close their liquor stores. Prohibition will go into effect on the 31st. of December.
