**OBITUARY.**

Abraham Winger, a well-known and respected resident of the township of Vaughan died at his late residence near Carrville Sunday afternoon, Dec. 10, 1916. Mr. Winger was born near Hagersville, Haldimand Co., Dec. 11, 1852, and soon after his marriage removed to Edgeley where he farmed on the old Snider homestead, which later came into his possession. For a number of years he kept the store and post office at Edgeley, and later on he and his prother Henry, built the well-known cider and Jelly mill on the corner of his farm. A number of years ago he bought the old "Hard Farm," near Carrville, where he resided till his death. Mr. Winger was a man of powerful build physically, and untiring energy until the middle of last winter he had enjoyed a lifetime of unbroken health. Last Spring he sought medical advice, and learned that his heart was affected with Valvular trouble, and it was evident his days were numbered. Mr. Winger was an earnest Christian man, and for many years had been a minister in the Brethren (Tunke) church with which he united about 39 years ago.

He was twice married. His first wife was Catherine, daughter of the late Samuel Snider; his second wife who survives him, was Elizabeth, daughter of the late Jonathan Baker. He leaves six children to mourn the loss of a kind father.

The funeral services were held at his late home on Tuesday morning last, and were largely attended. The funeral sermon was preached by Rev. F. Elliott, assisted by the following ministers: P. Steckley, Isaac Swalm and J. W. Hoover. Interment in the Cobber Cemetery.
